TEACHER TIPS

AUTUMN BREEZE introduces new students to smooth, legato bowing. The Violin 1, Viola Alternate, and Cello Alternate parts utilize sustained dotted half notes and repeated quarter notes. This allows beginning students to focus on producing a smooth and steady tone. These parts can be performed with just piano accompaniment as an effective first concert piece.

As your students progress, additional parts can be added to your ensemble that teach more advanced skills. For example, the Violin 2 part features an obligato line utilizing both low and regular 2nd fingerings along with introducing some simple slurring patterns. The Cello part alternates between 2nd and 3rd fingerings while also introducing some slurring patterns. These more complex parts could also be performed by your teachers—along with your beginning students on their first concert—to add some additional texture to your beginning string orchestra.

When you utilize AUTUMN BREEZE with your beginning violin and viola students, we suggest they play it in a standing position. Before they begin playing, encourage them to gently shift their weight from one foot to the other (all in the same direction) like trees swaying in the breeze. Encourage them to maintain this smooth swaying motion—shifting direction on each measure—as they perform AUTUMN BREEZE. This is a very effective kinesthetic way for your young musicians to internalize the gentle pulse of the ³/₄ meter.
